**Step 9** Made direct amends to such people wherever possible, except when to do so would injure them or others.

**Tradition 9 (Short Form)** A.A., as such, ought never be organized; but we may create service boards or committees directly responsible to those they serve. **(Long Form)** Each A.A. group needs the least possible organization. Rotating leadership is the best. The small group may elect its secretary, the large group its rotating committee, and the groups of a large metropolitan area their central or intergroup committee, which often employs a full-time secretary. The trustees of the General Service Board are, in effect, our A.A. General Service Committee. They are the custodians of our A.A. Tradition and the receivers of voluntary A.A. contributions by which we maintain our A.A. General Service Office at New York. They are authorized by the groups to handle our over-all public relations and they guarantee the integrity of our principle newspaper, the A.A. Grapevine. All such representatives are to be guided in the spirit of service, for true leaders in A.A. are but trusted and experienced servants of the whole. They derive no real authority from their titles; they do not govern. Universal respect is the key to their usefulness.

**Concept 9 (Short & Long Form)** Good service leadership at all levels is indispensable for our future functioning and safety. Primary world service leadership, once exercised by the founders, must necessarily be assumed by the trustees.

## Editorial: On the 9th Step. . .

*“Made direct amends to such people wherever possible except when to do so would injure them or others.”*

Like others of the Steps, Number Nine is closely related to Number Three -- “to turn our will and our lives over to God as we understood Him.” If we have accomplished this step to any measurable degree, we have attained at least a small measure of humility and a realization of our dependence on Him.

Having prepared a list of all people we have harmed and brought ourselves to the point where we are willing to make amends to them, our Ninth Step is one calling for positive action. There is a world of difference between being willing to do a thing and actually doing it. How many times in the pre-A.A. state have we said “I am sorry, I won’t do it again” and felt that that constituted complete amends.

## **Editorial: On the 9th Step. . .** (continued fro page 1)

A sincere apology, with a true explanation to the person harmed, of what we believe to be the reason for our past actions can quite frequently readjust personal relations --but the A.A. realizes that this cannot take care of the ones we have really hurt and invariably these are the ones we should and do love most.

Most of us had at least a few years of real pathological drinking behind us when we first learned of the Twelve Steps. Those terrible years are the ones that become repulsive to us as we progress in our new-found life program for order and happiness--years in which our every action was influenced by alcoholic thinking, with all its implications. It naturally follows that whatever our state in life may be, those close to us bore the brunt of our outrageous behaviour. How can one make amends to a dear wife, son or daughter or parent who through no fault of their own truly suffered physically and financially and more important, mentally, the humiliation and embarrassment of going through life with a drunkard? A simple "I am sorry; it won't happen again" is not enough. It is not enough for us and it is not enough for the aggrieved person.

Direct amends, by all means, is a must, in restoring physical property to the rightful owner, paying debts willingly within our ability to do so and retracting the lie that hurt a reputation; but the real amends are made in scrutinizing our day-in and day-out conduct and keeping that conduct "on the beam." The loved ones whom we have hurt don't want their "pound of flesh." Whether they are still in daily contact with us or not, amends are best made to them by restoring the love and confidence and respect they once had for us by the action of right living. With that thought clearly in our minds that "first drink" is an improbability, even an impossibility and the well-rounded, good life we all yearn for becomes readily visible to us.

**Treasurer's Report** <Treasurer not present, Michael reported> - Total Revenues: 8,215.40; Cost of Sales: 2,004.59; Gross Income: 6,210.81; Total Expenses: 5,564.68; Net Income: 646.13

**Central Office Coordinator** Regarding upcoming increased prices on literature, Central Office will be maintaining the profit margin of about the 30-35% on the newly priced literature. We will be getting a new price list which will be sent to Alli so it can be posted on the web. Nicole (Ladies' Room) said that two different women, not just one, have recently benefited from the deaf interpreter working at their meeting.

We did actually pay out nearly all of our \$200 budgeted for interpreters last month, said Michael. Josh: Discount on cases of Hardcover Big Books? Michael Yes, 20 books in a case \$168 vs \$180 for single copy price, until the price changes. \$2 markup on the big book next month. Most of the prices on the books are going up by \$2, others for less.

**Alternate Central Office Coordinator** Phone calls down 300 from last year. Walk-ins down 40 or so, web hits are up. Weekends were only covered by about 75% regular workers, 25% subwere not transferred and therefore we had no night coverage on those nights. Volunteers are down. Please put the word out that we need volunteers. Going to Chicago to Central Office/Intergroup/AAWS/Grapevine Seminar, plan to attend at least five workshops, and report about it in November. Carpet to be cleaned, machinery has been volunteered, have had five gallons of paints donated. Volunteers to help.

**Member at Large** No report.

**Pass it On Editor** <not present, Mike reported> Mike reported Steve is hawking for birthdays and article submissions. Mike stated that any submissions made MUST be made by the 15th of ensure that the PIO is published on time.

**Media Librarian** Three hundred CD's now available, and one DVD. Made 9 copies of cd's that have never been returned. I won't be continuing in my role starting January. From Taos, follow NM 68 north 7 miles. Take NM 522 approximately 20 miles to Questa. Travel 3 miles past the spotlight in Questa to NM 378. Turn left onto NM 378 and follow the signs about 12 miles west to Wild Rivers Recreation Area.

Fees:

Self-service pay stations are located at developed camping, picnic and ballfield areas.

- Day Use: \$3.00/day per vehicle to use the area for 30 minutes or more. An annual day use pass, good for the calendar year, is available for \$20.00.

- Camping: \$7.00/night for one vehicle, \$10.00 for two. Maximum 2 vehicles and 10 people per site. (Additional vehicles may park in day use parking areas at \$3.00/day.)
